Dear theater family & friends,

Welcome to the forests and castles of Scotland for Shakespeare's classic tale of witches, murder, and revenge! Often referred to as "the Scottish play" due to its reputation for being cursed, it seems only fitting to have the opening show on Friday the 13th under a full moon! It is said that the curse comes from the original production being riddled with disasters or that the curse comes from real witches objecting to their portrayal. The ritual to perform when someone accidentally says "Macbeth" also varies. The most common one is to spin around three times, spit over your left shoulder and utter a profanity. Although this ritual is often performed during tech rehearsal for any show, it is really only necessary if you accidentally say "Macbeth"! Stories of the curse have changed over time but many theaters still maintain the tradition of calling it "the Scottish play" unless it is actually being performed in that theater.

The show you will see tonight is a result of an amazing number of hours of time and talent. Many thanks to Jane Farnol for the many hours of dedication in directing all aspects of the show, Rebecca Pokorski and her team for designing and building costumes for such a large cast, our stars for many hours learning difficult text and choreography, the one and only Andy who is a producing and set building marvel, our wonderful stage manager Laura Gilbert who keeps all the pieces working together so beautifully, as well as the many others who have contributed to the creation of this show. We hope you enjoy the final result!

As an all volunteer theater, we rely on a whole range of volunteers. Browse through this program to see the many people working behind the scenes as well as on stage. Some have extensive resumes and others are very new to theater. The magic of community theater is that there is room for all.
